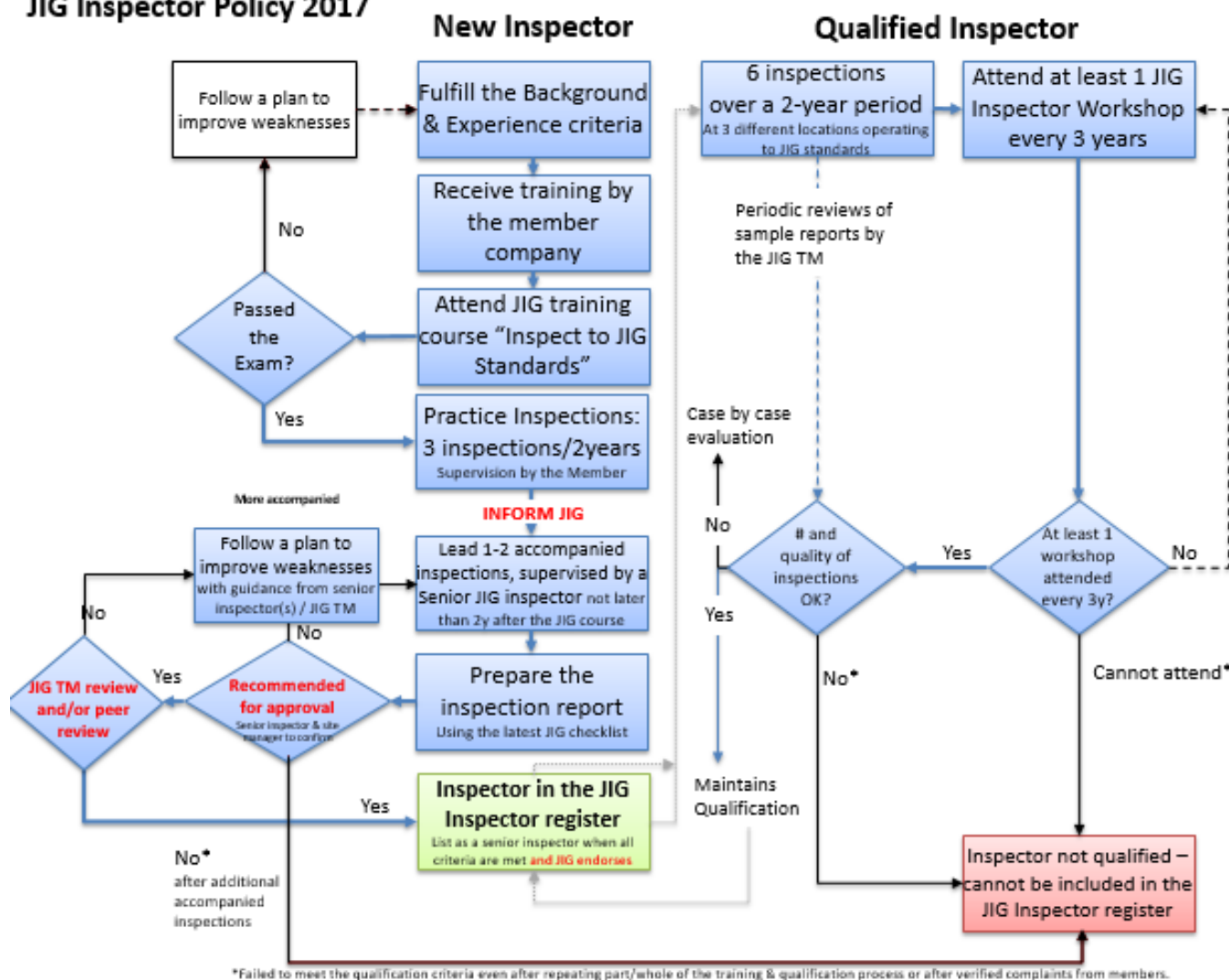


Qualifying as an Inspector

The flow chart below provides full details of the JIG inspector qualification process.

In summary, to become qualified, an Inspector must have been through the JIG training programme and passed the examination; performed three inspections of different locations operating to JIG Standards; and satisfactorily led at least one inspection accompanied by a Senior JIG Inspector or the JIG Technical Manager, prepared the report, and been recommended by the accompanying Senior Inspector for sign off by the JIG Technical Manager, followed by a successful review of the inspection report by the JIG Technical Manager. A second accompanied inspection may be required depending upon the experience of the individual. Any JIG member can nominate one or more of its staff to go through the qualification process. To maintain their qualified status, they have to attend at least one JIG Inspector Workshop every three years and complete six JIG inspections in any two-year period.

Only Senior JIG Inspectors can sign off newly-trained JIG inspectors following the accompanied inspections. Equally, only Senior JIG Inspectors can perform initial inspections at new facilities. A JIG Inspector will become Senior after three years provided that they have performed at least two inspections over the three-year-period at hydrant and/or off-

airport storage facilities, following validation and sign off by the JIG Technical Manager. In certain cases a JIG Inspector may qualify as Senior after two years if they have performed at least 10 inspections.
