

## Introduction

EI/JIG 1530 Quality Assurance Requirements for the Manufacture, Storage and Distribution of Aviation Fuels to Airports was the first single industry document to cover aviation fuel quality control upstream of airports. Since edition 1 was first published in November 2013, more than 550 copies to more than 180 fuel handling companies have been distributed worldwide.

The second edition of EI/JIG 1530 is now being finalised, with user feedback received since early 2016. Over 750 items were received by the EI and were processed by the EI Supply Chain Fuel Quality Subcommittee, an industry committee of experts from fuel supply and distribution organizations. JIG is represented in this committee by the Chairs and other members of the JIG Product Quality and JIG Operations Committees. The objective of the committee's work was to ensure the document remains current and increase its adoption globally. This review has now been completed and the draft produced is now ready for a wider public review and comment.

All comments shall reference the relevant clause in EI/JIG 1530, be placed in the applicable column of the form, provide details of the change being proposed along with suggested language and justification or reason for proposing the change. Comments will not be considered unless they are submitted in this format. Comments submitted for consideration shall be of a technical nature and not concern formatting or punctuation. Feedback from each organisation should be co-ordinated by one representative. The sources of all comments received by JIG and the EI will be treated in confidence and will not be disclosed to the committee responsible for reviewing the comments. It is noted that the final draft will be professionally proof read before publishing.

**Comments shall be submitted no later than 26<sup>th</sup> October 2018. Submissions received after 26<sup>th</sup> October 2018 will NOT be considered for inclusion in Edition 2.**

It is anticipated that the second edition of EI/JIG 1530 will be published at the end of May 2019. A new JIG Bulletin will be issued prior to the publication date, with further information on the updates made and actions required for implementation.
